The 2023-24 school year has come to a close for our 3,350 preschool, elementary and middle school students, and our graduated 8th graders are now preparing to bring the skills they have acquired from their education with Community Consolidated School District 93 (CCSD93) to high school. As we head into summer, please take a moment to

review the important updates from CCSD93 included within this newsletter.

Guided Goal Setting Helps CCSD93 Students Outperform Growth Expectations

Goal setting helps students achieve more. For this reason, in recent school years our teachers have placed a great emphasis on working individually with students to develop, set and track academic goals. By being active participants in this process, students become more aware of opportunities for improvement and take more ownership and responsibility for their own learning. With the onset of the CCSD93's 2023-2028 Strategic Plan this year, we have continued to prioritize student goal setting in order to meet our primary strategic priority: Student Success.

One reliable and straightforward metric for measuring and tracking educational progress is iReady, which is an adaptive assessment that is given in the areas of math and reading that adjusts its questions to suit a student's needs. In the fall, each CCSD93 student takes an iReady diagnostic test, and their results are combined with nationally normed data to determine what their typical expected growth would be by the spring. This is expressed as a number. As a student subsequently engages with iReady throughout the school year, they can track their progress toward their typical expected growth, seeing in real time whether they are lagging behind, meeting or exceeding expectations.

Our educators have been working with students throughout the school year to leverage the iReady system for personal goal setting. Students are informed what their expected iReady growth number is. They then meet with teachers to understand opportunities for academic growth and set goals and strategies for improvement, like recognizing and avoiding distractions to increase focus and re-reading questions to ensure understanding. Students then work to achieve their goals, and ultimately strive to beat their expected growth number.

The district partners ECRA, a student achievement data analyst, to measure our students' personal projected growth based on their own past educational performance. ECRA's statistical models are designed in such a way as to expect 84% of students to meet or outperform their targets for growth, and CCSD93's goal is to have greater than 84% of students meeting or exceeding their growth targets.


I am extremely pleased to share that the analysis of 2023-24 end-of-year spring test results shows that:

- 89% of our students are meeting or outperforming their personal math growth projections, 5% more than expected by statistical growth models.
- 86% of our students are meeting or outperforming their personal reading growth projections, 2% more than expected by statistical growth models.

While iReady is not the only way CCSD93 measures academic progress -- our amazing teachers use a vast number of classroom assessments and observations in addition to iReady to track growth -- it is a simple and effective method that also helps students recognize and celebrate the fruits of their learning. These results are due to the hard work and dedication of our educators, the commitment of our students, and the support of their families and our community.

Boundary Update to Take Effect in 2024-25



In March, CCSD93's Board of Education approved an update to its school boundaries starting in the 2024-25 school year. As a result of the approved boundary update, students who live in homes located within the area west of Kuhn Road, north of Lies Road, east of County Farm Road and south of Army Trail Road will attend Heritage Lakes Elemenary School and Jay Stream Middle School, instead of Cloverdale Elementary School and Stratford Middle School.

The update was recommended by a Superintendent's Boundary Committee that was charged with examining school attendance boundaries in an effort to address inequities across CCSD93's schools in regards to class sizes, unoccupied classrooms and student access to specialists. The committee's membership included parents from each CCSD93 elementary and middle school as well as school and district administrators and School Board members. Jay Stream Students Dive Deep Into Important Past & Future Changes



For weeks, 8th grade students in Jay Stream Middle School's advanced humanities worked on projects that called for them to delve deeply into the most important change they'd like to see in America in the next 20 years, or the most important change of the past 20 years. They performed thorough research, interviewed experts and analyzed multiple perspectives in order to ultimately create a video documentary and corresponding infographic on their chosen issue. They then showed off their work to parents, CCSD93 staff members and local dignitaries, who listened and asked probing questions. Among the topics addressed were the mental health effects of social media on teens, the continued emergence of artificial intelligence, the rising costs of healthcare, legacy college admissions, and the wide-ranging effects of the COVID-19 pandemic.
